Answers:

Middle Section (For all 3): totalitarian, secret police, single party rule, dictator, obedience/devotion to leader, indoctrination in schools, propaganda, censorship, persecution of minorities, terror through arrests/executions, no democracy, no individual rights, ideology of the party replaces religion, grew out of problems from WWI (14)

Section for both Fascism and Nazism: can be called fascist, hated the Treaty of Versailles, against communism/socialism, nationalistic, want to restore national glory/pride, militaristic, leader appointed legally, emotional speeches to large crowds, supported current social classes, appealed to middle/upper class and WWI veterans, grew out of issues with weak democracies, allowed one religion to exist, right-wing, did NOT come to power from a revolution (14)

Section for both Nazism and Communism: Concentration Camps, killed millions (2)

Section for both Fascism and Communism: blank

Nazism only: master race, anti-Semitism, Holocaust, lebensraum (living space), Hitler, brownshirts, Reichstag Fire Decree, Enabling Act of 1933, only one to come to power due to Great Depression (9)

Italian Fascism only: build new Roman empire, conquered Ethiopia, Mussolini, March on Rome, blackshirts, wanted more land from Treaty of Versailles (6)

Communism only: began with violent revolution, internationalist, Marxist, Lenin, Stalin, Cheka, desired classless society, persecuted all religions, atheist, Great Purge, collective farming, Five Year Plans, Holodomor, supported by lower/working class, left-wing (15)
